



-Black boys more likely to be suspended/expelled for similar behaviors in elementary school (Skiba et al., 2011)

-Biases about black boys

- More culpable (Goff et al., 2014; Eberhardt et al., 2004; Todd et al., 2016)
- Older (Goff et al., 2014)
- Less likely to feel pain (Dore et al., 2014)
- -"Shifting Standards" (Harber et al., 2012)
